# Did you know?

- Compensation rates for lab and lecture sections are now EQUAL across the district for all disciplines!
- Sub pay is available for ALL faculty that substitute for a colleague. Substitute pay is calculated based on the substitute hourly pay rate times the number of actual contact hours subbed.
- All faculty are eligible for the general pay raise UNLESS one of following <u>conditions exists</u>:
  - The faculty member has less than 3 months of service as of August 31
  - The faculty member has received a Level 2 warning during the past academic year
  - The faculty member received an overall "Needs Improvement" on the previous year's annual appraisal.
