Did you know?

Online Courses for Campus (non-iCollin) Faculty: Campus faculty may teach a portion of their load online if campus needs for staffing face-to-face and dual credit classes are met. Our compensation procedures permit campus faculty to teach up to 60% of their regular load online if 1) online sections are available and 2) they are not needed to teach face-to-face or dual credit courses (see p. 15). The District acknowledges that many campus faculty have extensive experience developing and teaching online courses in their discipline, and it has been clarified that:

 Although five sections of face-to-face courses are not required by the compensation procedures before an online course can be assigned to FT campus, regular load for faculty may, from time to time, have only face-to-face sections if campus needs require it.

• Faculty and staff are requested to collaborate and engage as a team in this process.

• Online courses are not restricted to "overloads" only.

The priority for assigning classes has been updated for both long semesters and the summer! Changes include prioritizing allowing FT faculty to teach up to 12 hours for faculty in the summer and clarifying how fall and spring semester assignments are made. Log in to CougarWeb and click on **Guidelines for Teaching Assignments** to find out more about how Full-time faculty class assignments are prioritized. It is under My WorkPlace, and at the middle of the page near the bottom under "Inside Collin" and titled "Guidelines and Priority Order for Teaching Assignment.

We encourage you to be familiar with these compensation guidelines, updated 09/15/2023, and verify that your faculty load is calculated correctly.
