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Note from the FC President...

The Faculty Council has been hard at work to provide faculty input on a variety of procedures. On Friday, Feb 16, FC voted to provide input on a standard operating procedure for faculty absences, update recommendations for faculty overload assignments, and voted to recommend to allow a temporary grade of "0" to be assigned for assignments that have been referred to the DOS for academic dishonesty. For full details, please contact your FC rep or review the FC website for the minutes when approved and posted in early April.

Faculty Council representation was also reviewed and approved to expand to 29 FT reps (representation based on the number of Full-Time faculty in each of the Academic and Workforce divisions) and 6 Adjunct Faculty reps (1 each from Plano, McKinney, and Frisco; 1 at large, 2 Workforce) for 2024/25.

Last year, the Full-Time Faculty scholarship fund awarded four full scholarships of \$1,500 plus three book scholarships of \$500 for a total of \$8,000 awarded! If you are interested in transferring to a new campus and wonder if you are eligible or what the process looks like, please review these <u>Full-Time Faculty Transfer Procedures</u>.

- Adjunct faculty are eligible for some sick leave. Adjunct Sick Leave Benefit details (found on page 30-31 in the Faculty Compensation Guidelines) include:
 - Adjunct faculty are eligible to use sick leave to cover up to the equivalent of one
 week of classes per semester. The amount of sick leave an adjunct is allotted each
 semester is determined by how many contact hours they have that semester. This
 amount will be on the Faculty Load report under the column LE/LB/Both hours total.
 - Available sick leave will be used for absences reported by the Associate Dean's
 office. The Associate Dean/Director will work with the Adjunct faculty to complete
 a Leave Request Form indicating the reason for missing class time. If the reason
 checked is sick leave, Human Resources (HR) will deduct the appropriate amount of
 sick leave from the allocated hours.
 - Once the Adjunct has used all sick leave, leave without pay will be initiated for further absences.
 - Sick leave does not accumulate from one semester to the next semester. The college does not pay out unused sick leave at the end of a semester.

In Other News...

- Questions about the Title IX process? See the process flowchart on page 44 of the <u>Title IX process document</u>.
- Questions about summer load? The priority for assigning classes has been updated for both long semesters and the summer! Changes include prioritizing allowing FT faculty to teach up to 12 hours for faculty in the summer prior to making other instructional assignments. Log in to CougarWeb and click on Guidelines for Teaching Assignments to find out more about how Full-time faculty class assignments are prioritized. It is under My WorkPlace, and at the middle of the page near the bottom under "Inside Collin" and titled "Guidelines and Priority Order for Teaching Assignment.
- Reminder: Our compensation procedures permit campus faculty to teach up to 60% of their regular load online if 1) online sections are available and 2) they are not needed to teach face-to-face or dual credit courses (see p. 15).
- COE Professional Development/Travel funds are low...submit your Spend Authorization in Workday for travel this academic year soon. Details on what is required to request funds is on the COE website in the Faculty tab of CougarWeb.

- Hybrid Course Class Visit Committee Opportunity... There are inherent differences in the way faculty conduct a hybrid course as compared to a traditional lecture course, but administrators and directors use the same course observation form for both modalities. As a result, faculty have been asked to provide input in the creation of a separate and distinct course observation form for hybrid courses taught throughout the district. The Faculty Council has created an ad hoc task force to facilitate this request. If you are interested in serving on this task force, especially if you have a lot of experience teaching hybrid courses, please contact Matt Hamilton.

• An Update from Craig Leverette regarding Dual Credit/Districtwide Scheduling:

Launching the new P12 Partnerships and Districtwide Scheduling Department has brought all components of dual credit under one umbrella. Additionally, we have begun assembling the staff and resources for the district wide scheduling component.

We are maintaining four primary goals throughout our Development: communication, efficiency, consistency, and a reduction in issues. With the growth of the college and our partnerships, we see this department as a vital piece in the overall experience for our students, staff, and faculty. With the onset of HB 8, the timing could not be better.

Collaboration with all stakeholders will be imperative as we progress to create buy-in and foster transparency. Recent changes to the Faculty Handbook included:


- Corrected broken links resulting from our move to a new website
