Embedded Textbooks in Courses:

- Embedded textbooks in courses would make the cost of purchasing textbook part of course cost.
- Concerns/questions:
  - o Do faculty lose the ability to choose materials?
  - Are students required to purchase new book as part of course cost instead of purchasing used books?
  - o Is this an academic freedom issue?
  - o This policy serves companies (publishers/bookstore) instead of serving students.
  - Some departments require online homework management systems. Embedded textbooks can ensure all students purchase the online HMS and are prepared to begin class on first day.
  - o What about faculty who use Open Stax material?
  - o Would this be electronic textbooks only, or include printed books?
- Question has been submitted to the academic freedom committee for review and recommendations.

#### Academic Ladder Committee Report September 28, 2018

The Academic Ladder Committee consists of Debra St. John, Randy Collins, & Kat Balch from the Frisco Campus; Gina Perkins from the McKinney Campus; and Tony Howard, Gerald Sullivan; and Mike McConachie from the Plano Campus

Since the last FC meeting, we have been working on the first charge given us: investigating if other community colleges have an academic ladder or rankings. So far, we have gathered data from eight institutions: Austin, Blinn, Dallas, El Paso, Lone Star, Maricopa, Miami-Dade, and Tarrant.

Three of these institutions-Dallas, Lone Star, and Maricopa-do not have faculty rank.

The other five have various forms that also vary in how rank is determined. It appears the most common way is some combination of degree plus graduate hours or years of experience. Austin even applies rank to its adjuncts (i.e., Adjunct Associate Professor). Of the ones we have looked at so far, Miami-Dade has the most complex with junior and senior faculty and two ranks within each. Tarrant's is the simplest.

Email discussions have started on the second part of our charge: Should Collin adopt some type of faculty rank or academic ladder? While the email discussion certainly has a drift, we need more time to discuss and firm up what the decision might be. We may be ready with a final report by the October FC meeting, but we will certainly meet the November deadline.
