# Upcoming FC Election (Procedures and Nominations)

Nominations ongoing for upcoming elections. Nomination period will close end of day March 15.

# FC Candidate Announcement Procedures (Procedures and Nominations)

In the November meeting, a review of the process was sent to this committee. They will experiment with including candidacy statements from reps and officers during the upcoming election. A modified version from that used during adjunct election will be used. The candidates will have a chance to make a case for why they believe they are well suited to represent faculty. Candidates for representative will have 250-word limit; candidates for officer will have 300-word limit.

# Point of Order

Kim Nyman moves to add item to agenda regarding retaliatory terminations of Reps. Jones and Heaslip. Vote is taken: 12 No and 19 Yes.

Kim reads Statement of Support that she has prepared.

Motion by Rep. Rodriguez, second by Rep. Adams.

Discussion by Barbara Stern: there is a concern that passing a statement of support for our colleagues might imply the Council is obligating itself to support their legal fight.

Motion by Rep. Wohead to amend the statement before voting to keep sentence 1 and first half of sentence 2 and add that we in FC have observed their collaborative efforts. Second by Rep. Cartwright. If the amendment passes, then we vote on the amended motion. Votes are 3 Yes, 26 no.

Back to original statement. It was edited as a group effort. Vote taken: 10 No, 19 Yes. Statement of Support passes.

#### Discussion on Tenure and Reprisals (Roger Ward)

Rep. Ward initiates discussion about the reasons for seeking to adopt a tenure system at the college. A discussion of the benefits and disadvantages of such a system ensues. It is decided that an exploratory committee on the issue of tenure will be formed.

Next meeting will be on March 19.
